18.	Can occupants get safely from the vehicle into the house? In other words, is there a con- necting door between the garage and the house?						
19.	Are there remote-controlled garage doors? Can the vehicle be parked in a secured area with the nose directed to the open area?						
20.	Do employees get paid above the minimum salary scale? What other alternatives are there and are employees aware that it is an alternative to remu- neration?						
21.	Has possible "troublemakers" been identified and are they handled differently?						
22.	Is there a safe?						
23.	Is the safe hidden and are the keys of the safe (if any) stored in a safe place?						
24.	Is there a safe room in the house where the family can hide in case of an attack?						

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25.	Are the bedrooms separated from the rest of the house by security gates?			
26.	Is there effective communica- tion with local neighbourhood watches, private security and the SAPS?			
27.	Is there good cellphone recep- tion?			
28.	Are there landlines?			
29.	Is there trustworthy alternative communication, for example, two-way radios?			
30.	Is there communication with a central control room?			
31.	Is the radio network monitored 24 hours a day?			
32.	Are there beams outside?			
33.	Is the outside alarm connected to floodlights?			
34.	Can the fence be monitored (CCTV)?			
35.	Is there a reaction unit that can react to a distress call?

43.	Is there an emergency plan if a sound is heard outside or if strange visitors show up?						
44.	Does the house look reinforced from the outside? What has been added to make it stand out? Warning signs?						
45.	Is there a solid or vibracrete wall around the residence?						
46.	Do the residents belong to a safety structure (farm watch/ neighbourhood watch)?						
47.	Do the residents participate in the activities of the safety structure?						
48.	Does a formal management structure exist in the safety structure?						
49.	Do members get tasked and scheduled for patrols?						
50.	Is there communication be- tween patrol members?						
51.	Does each member know pre- cisely what their responsibili- ties are and how to act at the time of an incident?						

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52.	Does the safety structure have contingency plans?			
53.	Do all the residents leave/come home at the same time each day?			
54.	If the owner pays wages in cash, do employees know on what days it is withdrawn and where it is locked up?			
55.	Is soil turned over/swept so that one can see footprints?			
56.	Are large amounts of cash kept in the house?			
57.	Are firearms locked up in the safe when it is not carried on the owner's body?			
58.	Is everyone in the household trained to use the available firearms?			
59.	Does serviceable fencing exist that is high enough (more or less 2 metres)?			
60.	Is the fencing in such a state that it is an effective deterrent?			
61.	Is the electrical fencing (if any) functional and safe for non- intruders?			
62.	Are there fire breaks around the house/yard?			
63.	Is there adequate fire-fighting equipment available?			
64.	Do all the occupants of the house have the contact details of the neighbours?			
65.	Is the panic button that the security company activated tested regularly?
